




- ➤ Micah lived and wrote in the 8th century B.C.
- The united Israel of David and Solomon had ended and divided into 2 kingdoms: Judah and Ephraim
- Judah still revolved their faith around the Torah and the Temple in Jerusalem
- Under King Jeroboam, Ephraim/Israel established its own priesthood and temple, based in Samaria





- > Micah of Moresheth-Gath his extended name
- Micaiah Ben Imlah is spoken of in 1st Kings
- Micah a Judean, from the town of Moresheth-Gath
- An era ended and a new began when King Uzziah died in 740 B.C.
- Assyria overtook nations bringing their culture, religion, and religious institutions with them





THE REST OF THE WORLD


- In the same time as Micah:

- 5) India in a huge religious transition
- > A world of transition



- Micah's writing style is abrupt, rough, shorthand
- Subjects change midsentence, plays on words, switches from symbolism, to simile, to literal narrative
- Some commentators prefer to re-write Micah's sentences
- Hand copying always produced some errors
- Ancient literary protocols were neither standard nor written down, unlike modern Western standards




CHAPTER 1 MALACHAI RECEIVES THE WORD OF YHWH

- Vs. 1 is the Superscription
- The body of the message only begins in vs. 2
- Gen. 1:1 The Superscription for the entire Bible
- Only Micah received this prophecy
- Saying that this is the word of God means it is authentic
- Does not mean "words" of God
- Some words are Micah's




- Micah prophesied under the Judean kings Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah
- Micah 1:2 "Listen, peoples, all of you!"
- Verse opens with shema, then to complete the poetic parallel uses the word qashab (incline your ears)
- > The reference to earth means to our planet itself
- Our planet's geography will be affected due to the judgment
- Zechariah 14:3 4



- > Le-ed means "be witness" in a judicial setting
- The Cosmic Temple, Mt. Sinai, and earthly Temple all have the same structure and purpose
- Adonai Elohim is literally Adonai Yehoveh
- God is sovereign over all people and all places
- > A declaration of absolute monotheism



- A theophany. God will shatter peoples and nations, and the earth will convulse
- All will be judged: But God's own people will be first!
- > Hinneh! Behold. A sense of suddenness.
- ➤ Ezekiel 38:1 12
- What is coming will be unexpected



- The high places are probably everywhere on earth, not just in Israel
- From hills, to piled earth, to Ziggurats, also opulent buildings with spires and obelisks... for false gods
- Darak = trample down, subjugate, incursion
- Micah 1:4 "Beneath Him the mountains will melt..."



- Nature is terrified at God's appearance
- Micah 1:5 Why is all this happening?
- > The cause is the crimes of Jacob, the sins of Israel
- It is YHWH reacting to these things
- The capital cities of the 2 kingdoms are mentioned: Samaria and Jerusalem, the source of the corruption
