



MICAH CHAPTER 4: Redemption/Restoration



- Micah and Isaiah were contemporaries
- The first 3 chapters were about judgment
- Redemption emanates from Jerusalem
- Gentile nations will stream to this new House of God
- They come to hear and learn the Torah, the Law... to be obedient
- The Church has spiritualized this away as not real

EZEKIEL'S TEMPLE



- Christians from gentile nations will have to be taught the Torah, while they have to unlearn false doctrines
- Ezekiel spends 8 of it's final 9 chapters on the details of this new Temple; this is REAL and not symbolic
- The final chapter speaks of the new division of land for the 12 tribes of Israel

- We need to take up obedience to the Torah NOW!
- Matthew 5:19
- God has always organized His creatures into a hierarchy
- Why would anyone choose to be the least of anything?
- Yeshua will be teacher and judge
- Practicality says Yeshua will teach leaders






CREATING UTOPIA

LEVERAGING THE WISDOM OF HUMANITY FOR YOUR GREATEST WORK




- Micah 4:3
- The hope of mankind: no more war, only peace
- Marxism teaches that only humanity can create a utopia, because God and His Law is the problem
- The nations to be judged mean gentile nations
- The Law of Moses will be the judging standard for all

- Hammurabi ruled in the 1700's B.C.
- He gave his people a stable and known set of rules
- Question: what does God use to inform us of His ways of right and wrong?
- The Torah is far superior to Hammurabi's code
- The Church has demonized and abolished the biblical code and replaced it with its own rules
- Our Savior says we are to obey the Torah and the Prophets as God's ways



THE REVERSAL



**“...they shall beat their swords
into plowshares”**
Isaiah 2:4

- Plenty of food is the biblical way of expressing abundance and peace
- Joel 4:9 – 12
- Instead of nations learning war from Nimrod, they learn peace from God
- Micah 4:4 A time of no poverty or crime
- 100% guaranteed because YHWH spoke it!

MICAH 4:5

The way it is for now




- Micah 4:5 is like a parenthesis
- Micah sees that the way things are now will be different later on (in the Kingdom)
- Gentile nations and peoples will still walk with other gods
- Israel will walk with YHWH and the Torah
- Micah 4:6 – 7
- A contrast between Vs. 5 and vss. 6 – 7

- Before the End of Days, the 12 tribes must be re-assembled
- In 1948, the Jews could return
- Jews = Judah and Benjamin that practice Judaism
- 10 tribes = NOT Jews but they are Israelites
- When prophetic fulfillments start to happen, it can be very sudden
- Time gets compressed



TOWER OF THE FLOCK



- Micah 4:8
- Literally Migdal-Eder
- The “hill” is Ophel
- Genesis 35:16 – 21
- This is likely a reference to the birth-place of David
- Ophel was the seat of David and Solomon’s Kingdom
- This is the model for the Kingdom of the End Times
- Bat-Zion personifies Zion as a pure virgin

- Micah 4:9 – 10 is one thought
- Two “nows”.
- 1st “now” = a woman in labor pain
- 2nd “now” = out of a city and into a wilderness
- Vss. 1 – 8, restoration
- Vss. 9 – 10, misery
- God’s many warnings have fallen on deaf ears
- Some heed and mature, others don’t
- Matthew 13:1 – 9
