ZECHARIAH 10


First 5 versus of chapter 10 a contrast between God's power and the failures of false leaders

The deceivers offer empty visions and false comfort

God will strengthen the House of Judah, and save the House of Ephraim through them

Knowing God's Word is not enough; we must live it!

- God puts grave responsibility on leaders
- A ship with a broken compass departs, and just gets further off course
- Those sounding the alarm get thrown overboard as heretics
- God's remedy?
 Get off that ship and onto another with a working compass





 Zechariah 10:6 says that God will strengthen Judah in order to rescue the House of Joseph
 Using "Judah and Joseph" circles back to a time of Israel's unity
 This speaks of a transition, and it is presented poetically

GOD IS THE SUBJECT



- God MAKES Judah mighty
- God SAVES the 10 Lost Tribes
- OT "saved" means to be delivered from a foreigner oppressor
- In the End Times, it means both saved from our sins, and from an oppressor
- *Racham* = compassion
- > Rechem = mother's womb

YHWH WILL HEAR ISRAEL'S CRIES


Vs. 6 is about a reversal of Israel's condition
 God did NOT permanently reject Israel

Vs. 7, the people of Ephraim will be like heroes


Judah was exiled for 70 years. For Ephraim it has been 2700 years...and counting!

Amazing that tribes of Ephraim think of Israel as their homeland... a place they have never known

"I WILL WHISTLE"




Sharaq = whistle or hiss Perfect tense... ongoing action Ezekiel 37:11 – 14 It is the spiritual influence of God that causes Ephraim to want to come back Padah = redeem or ransom, in the exodus sense of it Deut. 7:8 It does NOT mean **Ephraim first becomes Believers before return**



The population of Ephraim will increase during exile, and continue to increase when they return

- Ezekiel 36:9 11
- Zechariah 10:9 Cast into foreign lands as metaphorical "seeds" that were sown
- Israel will face a crisis of insufficient land (see Zech. 9)




> Ashur (Assyria) = north Egypt = south

Lebanon = west Gilead = east

The general area the 10 Lost Tribes return from

 This is the crude way a person in Zechariah's day would have understand the geography of the Earth
 They had no compasses for precise map directions



 Exiles from God's view are all the Israelites still not back in the homeland
 Zech. 10:11 MUST be seen from the ancient view
 Water mysterious, scary, deities control the waters
 Psalm 74:13 - 17

Ocean Myths and Legends

 Water was life... Rivers and streams also were life
 But, God is so powerful He can control all the waters
 This means Assyria and Egypt are no match for God
 Zech. 10:12 God will make the returning Ephraimites strong because of His compassion
 This God is mobile! He could go wherever they went
