
ZECHARIAH 11 REVIEW




Chapters 9 – 14 called Second Zechariah

- The most variously translated of all Bible books
- Speaks mostly of the End Times, but also about the history before Zechariah, and during his day
- Chapter 11 is gloomy, but includes the joy of the return of the 10 Lost Tribes

Judah (Israel) will be strong and facilitate the Tribes' return



- Numbers of people of the 10 Lost Tribes returning will not all fit into Israel
- The false shepherds over Israel are mostly their religious leaders
- Yeshua as the Messiah will Himself deal directly with ridding Israel of their bad shepherds, probably includes Christian leaders as well



> Is God or Zech. speaking in vs. 9? > 2 or more fulfillments of this prophecy > Applies to Zech. and to later events > Won't shepherd because "they detested me..." The bad shepherds are pleasing the flock


FATE OF THE FLOCK

- > 1) Whoever is dying will die
- > 2) Whoever is to be destroyed will be destroyed
- > 3) Whoever is left shall devour
- In modern times, the religious shepherds of Israel are the Rabbis
- In Christianity they are Pastors, Priests, Bible Teachers, Professors
- A role reversal for Prophets is coming

THE LAW



NO RULES = NO SINS

Zech. breaks staff into 2 > Represents the Covenant becoming ineffectual, not abolished If God didn't give Adam the rule about the Tree, they couldn't have sinned If Yeshua abolished the Law, then there can be no sins to have to be saved from Matthew 5:17 - 19




Jeremiah 31:30 – 36

- > 1) New Covenant NOT made with gentile Church
- > 2) Not about abrogating the covenant, it's the violation of it
- > 3) First given on stone tablets, now written in human hearts
- > 4) Hebrew says "I will put My TORAH within them"
- > 5) Chadash = fresh, re-newed, re-dedicated
- 6) God says His Laws don't end until the sky can be measured

MESSIAH YESHUA THE WAY THE RUTH AND THE LIFE

- Meyers: "The new covenant will be the same as the old... "
- A good shepherd doesn't mean a perfect shepherd; only Yeshua was/is the perfect shepherd
- Zech. 11:11 "On that day when it was broken..."
- God imposed upon the nations not to harm Israel
- When the covenant was broken, Israel was given into the hands of the nations



Zech. 11:11 "the most miserable of sheep..."
Probably better "the merchants of the flock..."

- Sheep or shepherds they somehow knew they were genuinely hearing from God
- God's Word brings power and God's will
- Manmade doctrines are man's will and weak

- > Zech. 12 "give me my wages…"
- > A deep irony, here
- True Prophets of God did not expect to be paid
- Prophet guilds produced men who wanted to be paid for prophesying
- True Prophets do NOT want to be Prophets!
- > Amos 7:12 14
- So, why is Zechariah asking to be paid?
