

BROKEN BUT NOT REVOKED



The Church says to "break" the covenant is to revoke it... NO! > To break means to invoke the (curses) consequences > Meyers: "The new covenant will be the same as the old..." \succ In the final 5 chapters Zechariah's present and future can be spoken of in a single statement

- The Prophet had just broken his staff, so, what is the shepherds' reaction?
- Bad shepherd admits that this message is authentically from God
- But... He doesn't necessarily think it applies to him
- > 30 pieces of silver (shekels) is a small amount
- The price of a slave
- This offer was very offensive so the money was thrown back


"If it seems good to you..."



30 PIECES OF SILVER > AN EXPRESSION OF LOW VALUE



Hosea 3:1 30 pieces of silver is what Hosea paid to get back Gomer Matthew 26: 14-16 Judas's famous 30 pieces of silver for Yeshua's life > 2 fulfillments, might there be a 3rd? The shepherds were probably Temple representatives



 Literally "throw into the treasury" is "throw it to the potter"
 Matthew 27:5 – 7 A burial yard for poor and foreigners


Potter" the title of a person who worked at the Temple treasury

THE DIVINE DIVORCE OF ISRAEI

- Prophet snaps 2nd staff, breaking kinship between Judah and Israel (Ephraim)
- > 2 symbolic acts about creating a national crisis by exiling and dispersing His people
- > 1) Breaking Covenant
 2) dividing Israel into 2 kingdoms
- God says in the future He will reverse this
- Israel has remained God's people all along



"Christians don't talk about it that much."



- God's covenants are forever
- Gen. 7:17
- ➤ 1Chron. 16: 15 17
- Hebrews 13:20
- 3 different covenants spoken of as forever
- If God changed His mind about any covenant in the past, might He not do the same about the New Covenant?
 Jeremiah 31:30

- Zechariah and other Prophets have given us a wealth of truth
- > Zech. 11:15
- Keli = garb, accessories, tools of the trade
- False shepherds are now wearing the garb of True Shepherds
- > Zech. 11:16
- God will raise up a shepherd with all the negative aspects



What If Your Pastor Is Wrong?



- God knows who His Prophets are and aren't
- Era of God-sent Prophets was coming to a close
- NT "prophet" is one who professes/teaches God's existing Word, doesn't add new revelations
- Spirit of the false shepherd is alive today
- If what they say doesn't match the Bible, they're false

GOOD SHEPHERD How can I tell? BAD SHEPHERD

- Good shepherd Ezekiel 34:12 16
- Bad shepherd Zechariah 11:16
- Negative characteristics of a bad shepherd:
- I) Has no interest in going to sheep destined for destruction in order to tell them truth to help them



- > 2) Will not seek out the youth who are aimless and unsettled to protect and direct them
- S) Will not heal the broken... those are physically infirm, or psychologically/emotionally infirm
- > 4) Won't feed the hungry... physically or spiritually
- 5) Preys on the fatted sheep to take all they have and leave nothing for the poor or needy in spirit

IS IT OK TO JUDGE



Yes, we ARE to judge, but not to condemn

- Zechariah 11:17 "Woe to the worthless shepherd..."
- God is cursing the bad shepherd
- The purpose of a shepherd is to lead and protect
- Vss. 16 & 17 look towards the End Times
- The arm and right eye are about the body and the mind that allows the bad shepherd to do wrong
