




LINKS AND CONNECTIONS

- OT not always in chronological sequence
- In a nation several isolated things can be happening simultaneously that affect each other
 - Secular history is seen to be coincidental
- But with God's people history is controlled by the Lord
 - The issue for the writer becomes how to explain many events that work together to form the whole story

PUTTING TOGETHER THE PUZZLE PIECES OF HISTORY

- Timelines, footnotes, appendices and more all used to put the puzzle pieces of history back together
- Book of Kings dealing with 2 Israelite kingdoms, plus relationships with gentile nations
- Life of Elisha is providing the context for a more complete picture
- Chapter 8 begins with a flashback

2ND KINGS 8: RELATED STORIES

- Chapter 4, Shunammite woman whose son was resurrected by Elisha
- Now we find out that afterwards Elisha also warned her of a coming famine
- 1) 7 years of famine
- > 2) Sojourn to a foreign land
- 3) Famine caused by God
- Famine to be in Israel and Judah but nowhere else
- > 2Kings 4:35 38

WHY IS GEICHAZI WITH THE KING?

- Woman returns to find squatters occupying her home and property
- She goes to King Y'horam and Geichazi, Elisha's servant, is there
- Rabbis puzzled as according to 2nd Kings chronology by now Geichazi had Tzara'at, so shouldn't be at the palace
- Perhaps this was chronologically before the Na'aman incident
- Or....perhaps his *Tzara'at* was hidden by his clothing
- A mystery








WOMAN'S LAND RETURNED

- Most biblical famines are NOT the complete absence of food
- Shortages cause high prices, which cause hardship on the poor
- Woman to be compensated for food grown on her land
- No Israelite owned the land, it was like a lease
- God owned the land
- Kinsman Redeemer paid price based on crops grown
- Linked with siege of Chapter 7: faith<u>less</u>ness brings disaster, faith<u>ful</u>ness brings restoration


ELISHA SENT BY GOD TO ANOINT HAZA'EL AS KING OF ARAM



- Elisha goes to Damascus
- Syria = Aram
- Strange that a Syrian would accept being chosen by a Hebrew to become king!
- Elijah was first given this commission but left this earth before it happened
- 1st Kings 19:11 18
- Elisha must have been full of anxiety knowing in advance that Haza'el would be a cruel tormenter of Israel
- Alfred Edersheim, 19th century Christian Jewish scholar, godfather of Hebrew Roots movement

GOD USED GENTILES TO PUNISH HIS PEOPLE

- WHY ??? Should be asking WHICH??
- Faith and obedience don't judge God or His motives
- Haza'el would be anointed to punish the northern kingdom
- Nebuchadnezzar would be anointed to punish the southern kingdom
- Jeremiah 27: 1 10

ISRAEL AND SYRIA'S LONG RELATIONSHIP

- An on-again off-again relationship especially with Damascus
- Issues were with governments
- The people were probably intermarried and had family in each kingdom
- High Priest Zadok moved to Damascus and started a Levite colony
- Essenes of the Dead Sea Scrolls had a large community in Damascus

HAZA'EL GREETS ELISHA WITH GIFTS

- Ben-Hadad sent Haza'el to ask Elisha if he would survive his illness
- > 40 camels to bring gifts
- Doesn't mean the camels were fully loaded
- The idea was for lots of pomp and circumstance
- "Your son, Ben-Hadad.."
- A son is under the authority of his father
- A brother is an equal



HAZA'EL: A WOLF IN SHEEP'S CLOTHING

- Haza'el saw Ben-Hadad's deference to Elisha as a great insult to Syria and a sign of weakness
- "you WILL recover" ???
- Va-yomer elay ve Elisha lek emor <u>lo</u> chayyah
- > **Lo** = no, not
- You will NOT recover
- Means: 1) you will NOT die of your illness, but 2)you will die of something else
- Haza'el already had been thinking of murdering Ben-Hadad
