## MANASSEH THE WICKED KING

- Manasseh replaced his father, Hizkiyahu
- 2nd Kings 21 lists the terrible sins of Manasseh
- King Hezekiah forced reforms on the people
- Manasseh released the people from those righteous reforms



### FRUIT OF THE OLD NATURE

- ➤ Gal. 5:19 23
- Sexual immorality, impurity, drugs, occult, selfish ambition, angry
- Despite Hezekiah's efforts, the people stayed rooted in their old nature
- > 2Kings 21:16
- > 2Kings 21:8, 9
- The people did not shema to YHWH
- God usually gives us the leaders we deserve
- Good leaders cannot forcibly change hearts and souls
- Bad leaders cannot forcibly turn the righteous into the wicked



# MANASSEH KILLED ISAIAH




- 2<sup>nd</sup> Kings 21:11 15 is God's oracle to Judah
- No named prophets for Manasseh
- Isaiah, possibly Nahum
- Later Jeremiah, Joel, Habakkuk would speak indirectly about the King
- To'evah = abomination, the worst of the worst sins
- Usually sins of humanity directly against God
- Manasseh held responsible for national judgment of Judah

# GOOD OR EVIL Who Decides?

- Human societies ignore what God calls good and evil
- That is precisely what King Manasseh did
- Our nation (and others) are on a collision course with God
- A church that agrees
   with or quietly accepts
   to'evah policies is like
   the corrupt Levitical
   Priesthood that became
   dormant


# GOD MEASURES JUDAH FOR JUDGMENT

- God says Judah is "crooked" beyond repair
- ▶ 1<sup>st</sup>, plate is wiped clean of contaminants
- > 2<sup>nd</sup>, turned upside for future use again
- After Jerusalem is cleansed, the corrupt things (the people) will return
- 2nd Kings 21: 14, 15 God says the "people" are also to blame for His judgment






# 2<sup>ND</sup> CHRONICLES 33: ANOTHER SIDE TO THE STORY



- Neither Manasseh or the people paid any attention to God's warnings
- ▶ Jeremiah 44:1 6
- The Lord used an enemy of Israel to punish His people
- King Manasseh taken to Babylon in chains
- King Ashurbanipal of Assyria resided in Babylon
- Babylon very difficult to hold on to


### MANASSEH REPENTS

- In prison, Manasseh realized his sins
- He prayed and confessed
- The Lord had mercy, and he returned to Judah a changed king
- Built up fortifications, tore down idols, cleansed the Altar of Burnt Offering
- Commanded his people to worship ONLY YHWH
- Manasseh, in reality, came home a trusted vassal and ally of Assyria




# GOD CHANGED HIS PERSPECTIVE OF MANASSEH

- For the 1<sup>st</sup> time in his life Manasseh was now getting divine instruction
- Prophet = Navi
- Navi is NOT a chozeh
- Probably a lesser level of inspiration
- Manasseh was changed for the last 6 years of his life
- He live out his days as a generally good king



# NO AGE LIMIT ON REPENTANCE



- Even people who have lived their entire adult lives in opposition to God have an opportunity of renewed life!
- Despite Manasseh's changed heart, he had done irreparable damage to Judah
- Usually we can't undo the harm our sin has done
- Heavenly forgiveness doesn't wipe our earthly and carnal slates clean

#### THE SHORT REIGN OF AMON

- 2<sup>nd</sup> Kings 21:17 speaks of the chronicles of the kings of Judah
- These are NOT the same as the Bible books of 1st and 2nd Chronicles
- Manasseh buried in the Garden of Uzza instead of the royal burial caves
- > Am eretz became a religious/political movement
- Amon became king at 22 years old, and ruled for 2 years
- He was assassinated by his royal court
- > The elders of the am eretz executed the conspirators
