
ESTHER CHAPTER 5: UNANNOUNCED AND UNINVITED

- Esther in the inner courtyard
- Esther forcing this confrontation, persuaded by Mordechai
- Greek additions are essentially "spin" building upon Greek stereotypes
- Additions interspersed between vss. 1 and 4, cannot be accepted






- Greek additions change the character of Esther and Xerxes and their relationship
- Greek: Esther is a cowering terrorized Jewish woman
- > Hebrew: Esther is humble, committed and courageous
- Greek: King Xerxes is ill tempered and impatient
- Hebrew: King Xerxes is affectionate, concerned and generous towards Esther
- Doesn't make sense that lowly handmaidens would be allowed in the inner court unannounced! Even Haman couldn't do that

KING HAPPY TO SEE ESTHER

- King inquires of Esther and her only request is that the king and Haman come to a private banquet
- "Banquet of wine" probably just means wine before the meal
- "Up to half his kingdom" is an expression of generosity
- Esther doesn't want to hurry matters, but rather wants to disarm the king and keep Haman unaware of the plan







THAT DARN MORDECHAI!!

- Much is happening quickly
- The next day after the 3 day fast Esther approaches the king, and that same day is also the first banquet
- Haman feels on top of the world!
- On his way home he encounters Mordechai who won't acknowledge him
- His mood was destroyed
- An issue of Shame and Honor



- Haman can't be happy as long as Mordechai and the Jews live
- Arab population: 400,000,000
- Israeli Jewish population: 7,000,000 (60 to 1 ratio)
- Arabs have 99.3% of all the "Middle East" land

ILLOGICAL IRRATIONAL

- Europe openly anti-Semitic
- USA leadership now tilting towards Arabs and away from Israel
- Haman's joy despite his wealth and power was destroyed unless the Jews were eliminated
- The Spirit of Amalek drives it all!
- God is Israel's only hope, just as God was the Jews only hope in Persia








75 FT. TALL GALLOWS?

"That night" = just after Haman met with his family


Xerxes can't sleep so he calls in a Scribe to read the "chronicles"

Haman outside in outer courtyard, wanting permission to kill Mordechai!


THE TABLES ARE TURNED

- King invites Haman to enter, as he needs an advisor
- King wants to honor Mordechai, but Haman thinks he's talking about him!
- Haman suggests: 1) put the King's own robes onto the person 2) ride the king's own horse 3) high official to lead the horse and proclaim the merits of the honoree
- Issue involves Shame and Honor
