


# PASSOVER & UNLEAVENED BREAD


- Matthew and Mark speak of Passover being 2 days away; John and Luke only say it is "near"
- Luke makes the terms Passover and Unleavened Bread interchangeable, but in the Torah they are 2 separate feasts
- Firstfruits isn't mentioned, but the timing of Firstfruits is relative to the Feasts of Passover and Unleavened Bread



\*Jewish days start/end at sundown

- This timeline defies Hebrew Traditions and the Torah
- The Last Supper cannot be the Passover meal because the lambs hadn't yet been killed and cooked
- Different Gospels speak of the "timeline" differently
- However, it is not that they differ, it is the way the terms are used that confuses







## Happy Holidays!



- The way Westerners speak of the Christmas and New Year holiday period is similar to how the Jews spoke of the Passover and Unleavened Bread holiday period
- How Hebrew days worked, how the Feast days worked & the difference between 7<sup>th</sup> day Sabbaths and the Great Sabbaths are critical in understanding the timing of these final events around Yeshua's death & resurrection





# ROME AND THE JEWISH PEOPLE


A conspiracy to kill

Their reasons for killing Him were political, not religious

- The Sadducees co-operated with the Romans
- Rome accommodated the Jews in some ways, hoping to have peace and calm
- The High Priest office was one that was bought & sold


#### **CAIAPHAS**

- Conspirators met in the home of Caiaphas, knowing they had to proceed with caution
- It was the festival period and religious zeal was running high
- It would be the thousands of visiting Galileans that would be most upset at Yeshua's death, and might riot
- The Zealots were also a huge concern




- Shim'on with *Tzara'at* (not Leprosy)
- Probably meant that in the past he had *Tzara'at* (but no longer)
- The intent was to show the contrast between the evil Caiaphas and this humble lower-class woman
- She dumps her expensive perfume on Christ's head
- She didn't know He was God's Son, the Messiah

# YESHUA IN BETHANY



### WHY?



- This woman probably didn't know why she did it
- Often, God will work His will through us without our having a clue about what's going on
- No one else in the room felt that same kind of impulse or understood why she did such a thing
- The disciples were upset at her, because such an expensive perfume could have been sold and the funds used to help the poor



- The woman did this act of symbolism without understanding it; Yeshua revealed its meaning
- There was no reason for the Disciples to understand it
- Christ's statement wasn't about dismissing the poor
- The intent was that there would be ongoing and endless opportunities to serve the poor
- But the time to serve Christ was soon over
