

- > Vss. 11 26 a chief source for anti-Semitism
- > Who is to blame? That is not what Matthew intended
- Three persons or groups: 1) Jewish religious leadership, 2) Pontius Pilate, 3) the crowd
- The leadership are the culprits
- > The misinformed cannot claim innocence



- The New Testament spends little time on the trial, death and resurrection of Yeshua
- The greater volume is spent on who He was, what He represents, and His instructions to us
- > James 2:19 26
- James uses body and spirit as metaphors for faith in Yeshua versus our actions. Both are required

A DIADEM OF THORNS



Jesus either at the Antonia Fortress or Herod's Palace

Scarlet cape, belonged to Roman Centurion

For the Romans, Yeshua's crime was treason

Jesus died as a political prisoner for political reasons

After mocking Him, they took back the robe

THE BRUTALITY OF THE PROCESS

- Flogging often left the man dying or dead
- Flagellum multiple leather arms with sharp metal and bone on the ends
- Shim'on of Cyrene, a Jewish pilgrim just arrived to Jerusalem
- Patibulum = crossbeam
- Carried by the victim to both humiliate and to weaken him





GULGOLTA

- > Skull
- Latin changed it to calvaria, which was made into English calvary
- Burial place is either where the Church of the Holy Sepulcher is, or somewhere near the Garden Tomb
- The execution was in a highly visible place, with roads and paths nearby







WINE AND GALL

- Before being nailed to the stake Christ was offered a pain killer
- Mark says it was Myrrh and wine
- No explanation why Yeshua refused to drink it
- Stauros was the Roman death stake
- Dice game for His clothes
- > Psalm 22:17 19


- Sign above Yeshua's head read: "This is Yeshua, King of the Jews"
- Message: any Messiah will wind up here. You have no hope.
- Earliest use of a "cross" was the Greek Tau
- Constantine made it the official Christian symbol
- No command of God for cross as a symbol
- "Love our fellow man" must be considered when choosing/using symbols and icons

Rome didn't execute common thieves


These 2 men were likely dangerous and harmed people

The issue of the Temple was sensitive

- People swore by the Temple, as if it was alive
- The insults and mocking fulfilled more prophecy
- > Psalm 22:7 8

"If you are the Son of God....."






- ➤ Matthew 4:3 6
- The jeerers are acting as Satan's agents, even using the same word formula!
- All the temptations had to do with Christ gaining something for Himself
- After the passers-by the Jewish religious leaders joined in the mocking
 - They said that He can't even save Himself
- They didn't understand the term "save" as meaning "salvation"

NO MORE SIGNS

- The Jewish leaders demand a sign that Jesus is who He says He is, by coming off the cross
- ➤ Matthew 12:38 40
- ▶ Psalm 22:9
- Even the 2 criminals join in the insults and slanders
- There are people who will go to their deaths insisting that if they are to be saved, they'll do it themselves



- ➤ Amos 8:8 10
- Was prophesied to happen at Festival time!
- Prophetic fulfillment often missed because we don't take it literally enough
- What kind of darkness?
- What was the extent of "The Land"?
