


- Ezra was a Priest and Torah Teacher, a religious leader
- Nehemiah was a politician, a secular government leader
- Nehemiah's mission:
- > 1) Raise the economy of Jerusalem
- > 2) Make Jerusalem defendable
- 3) Increase the population with Judeans
- Nehemiah had a spirit that was sensitive to God's instructions
- The Lord prepared and then called Nehemiah to a position of government leadership

THE MAKE-UP OF A BELIEVING COMMUNITY OF GOD

- ➤ 1Corinthians 12:4 27
- Every element of the community plays its role and is needed
- God does not favor leaders more than followers
- Our political leaders are blamed for our national problems
- God usually gives us the leaders we deserve, not the leaders that we need





THEY ARE A REFLECTION OF US!

- In Democracies, our leaders accurately reflect the citizenry
- Similar to *Tzara'at*, a spiritually caused sin disease that outwardly reflects the inner self
- Rarely, the Lord will raise up a leader that runs counter to the culture, to bring the community back to a Godly footing
- Nehemiah a government politician, would fight for practical, pragmatic, tangible things of everyday life for his people
- But Nehemiah was a Godly man, raised up by God for this job




TISHRI (CIVIL) CALENDAR YEAR







BIBLICAL (RELIGIOUS) CALENDAR YEAR

AN UNEXPECTED CONFRONTATION




- Persian kings were fond of wine and women!
- Nehemiah presents King and Queen with their wine at a banquet
- "Why is your face so evil..?"
- Panim = face = presence, countenance
- Rah = evil, bad, unpleasant
- The staff is not permitted to be "down" at a festive occasion
- It has been 4 months since Nehemiah learned about Jerusalem so why now is he depressed and hasn't spoken to the king about it?
- King may have been gone, or perhaps Nehemiah was getting cold feet!

GOD ANSWERS NEHEMIAH'S PRAYER

- If we procrastinate the Lord is liable to force the issue!
- Get up early and RUN to the righteous battle
- King was not annoyed; he was sensitive to Nehemiah's distress
- Desecration of the burial sites brought shame
- Loss of honor is intolerable
- The king couldn't have a man in his royal court who was in a social status of shame











- Jerusalem is not mentioned, but it was a given that this city is the object of the discussion
- Jerusalem was a sensitive issue, but strategically important to Artaxerxes
- Darius allowed Zerubbabel to rebuild Temple, but not walls
- Artaxerxes allowed Ezra to go to reform the religion and the Priesthood, but didn't rebuild walls
- Would the king trust Nehemiah to do what others couldn't do?



THE CHALLENGE OF REBUILDING THE WALLS



- Nehemiah was NOT Ezra
- He was a capable, pragmatic, politician
- Walls had lain in ruin for 175 years
- Artaxerxes' motives were political
- Nehemiah would be the Governor of Judah
- The king didn't know that it was God orchestrating everything from Heaven for His purposes

Nehemiah Used The King's Letters


"Then I went to the governors of Trans-Euphrates and gave them the king's letters. The king had also sent army officers and soldiers on horses with me." Nehemiah 2:9a NCV



- King asked how long Nehemiah would be gone, we don't know his response.....but he wouldn't return for 12 years
- Nehemiah got letters of safe passage and introduction
- Being named Governor of Judah created a firestorm
- Nehemiah seen as unwelcome competition from local and regional leaders who wanted control of Judah

NEHEMIAH'S MISSION APPEARED TO BE SECULAR

- Letter to Asaf, manager of royal forests, authorizing timber for gates, walls, and Governor's mansion
- Mansion a symbol of authority
- Rebuilding of walls intended to:
- 1) Create a formidable strategic outpost for the King
- > 2) Revive the economy
- 3) Grow the Jewish population
- 4) Provide safety and security for the people
- Sounds more worldly than pious



THIS IS THE WORLD, NOT HEAVEN



- The Father knows we need these things
- Sending another Priest, like Ezra, wasn't the answer
- Believers don't live on bread alone, but we need bread to live
- Harder to think on things of God on an empty stomach than when we're safe and secure
- Nehemiah had a partnership with God
- Ready to take action, takes risks and gets his hands dirty
- A role model of Godly let's-get-itdone leadership
