

GOD PRINCIPLES, MEDDLING, AND A PERSONAL CALL TO ACTION

- "....no share, right, or history to commemorate in Jerusalem..."







THE IMPORTANCE OF JERUSALEM

- Covenant of Abraham
- Jerusalem the ONLY city God has set His claim & Name
- Battle over Jerusalem is because of the Abrahamic Covenant
 - Bride of Christ is JERUSALEM!
- Rev. 21:9, 10
- Jerusalem = the redeemed city inhabited ONLY by God's redeemed people
- Abrahamic Covenant is the context for the book of Nehemiah








NEHEMIAH CHAPTER 8

- Wall complete on *Elul* 25
- Congregation meeting on Tishri 1
- > **Elul** = 6th month
- Tishri = 7th month
- Ezra could have been organizing the religious gathering while Nehemiah was finishing the wall
- 1st day of 7th month is Yom Teruah the Day of Trumpets
- Lev. 23:24
- Numbers 29:1

WHAT HAPPENED??





- Notice that Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement) is skipped over
- Yom Teruah somehow changed to Rosh Hashanah
- How can New Year's Day be on the 1st day of the 7th month of the year ?!
- The term Rosh Hashanah never appears in Scripture
- First documented instance of reference to Rosh Hashanna is in the 1st Century A.D., with Hillel and Shammai at the time of Paul
- Next instance is in the Mishna 200 A.D.


CALENDAR ISSUES


- Mishna says Rosh Hashanah to be used to count years, sabbatical cycle, Jubilee years
- Biblically, Nisan is the 1st month of the year
- So does it make sense that the 7th month, Tishri, is New Year?
- Torah and Tanach only number months (and days)
- All the names on the Jewish Calendar are Babylonian
- Doesn't really hurt anything, but it leads to a slippery slope

LITTLE THINGS BECOME BIG THINGS


- Jewish exile to Babylon brought a sea change in Jewish life and worship
- Karaite Jews do not follow modern Hebrew calendar
- Only about 5% of Jews ever returned to their homeland
- Jews assimilated into Babylon and Persia, adopted some of their ways and vocabulary
- Arah Tishritum = The month of beginning






- Very difficult to keep God's Word as time passes, the world evolves, and we create new traditions to deal with it
- After a couple of generations from a new tradition, no one asks where it came from or if it is right
- The Jews listening to Ezra were eager to hear God's Word because they understood how ruinous it was to rebel
- Men, women and children came; all mature enough to make sense of what was heard

EZRA READS THE LAW



- Ezra spoke for 6 hours
- People gathered by the Watergate
- 13 men stood beside him
- Proceeding commenced with prayer
- Ezra barach YHWH
- Great God, a Persian term = hagaddol Elohim
- People shouted Amen, raised their hands, bowed their heads, lay prostrate
- All of these expressions and more are acceptable to God



- > 13 more people are presented, all Levites
- They go through the crowd and help people understand
- Translate into Aramaic, answer questions, repeat it for those who couldn't hear Ezra
- This was precisely the function that God assigned to the Levites, to teach Torah

WHEN GOD'S WORD IS NOT MET WITH EXPECTANCY AND FAITH

- ▶ Mark 6:1 6
- If the speaking of God's Word doesn't bring a proper responsiveness from the listeners, there was no value to speaking it at all
- Yeshua became frustrated, so He did not do the miracles He came to do
- He left the villagers to themselves, and took His message and blessings to those who wanted them
