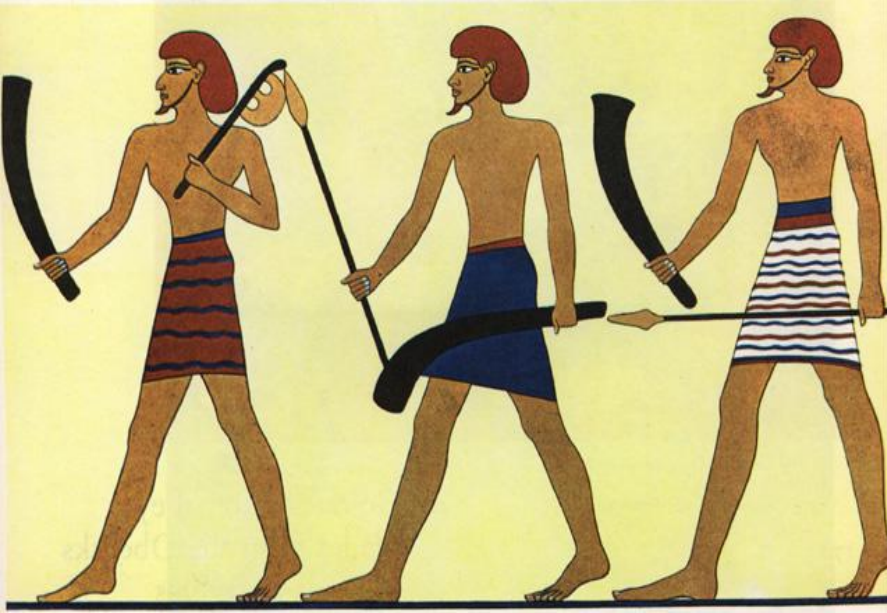


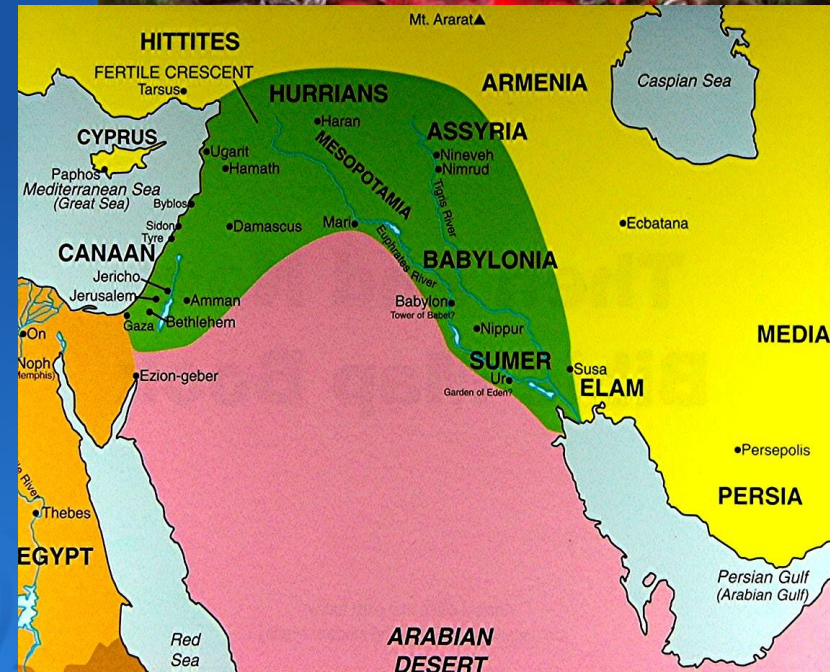
CANAANITES TO BE DRIVEN OUT

- Those who renounced their gods and tribal allegiances and joined Israel could remain
- The Lord warned that if Israel failed to do this, He would do to Israel what He planned on doing to the Canaanites!
- Allotment of territory based on lots and on each tribe's population



CONQUERING CANAAN: A BIBLICAL HIGH POINT

- The realization of a 600-year old covenant with Abraham
- For ancient Israel, was equivalent to our expectancy of the return of Yeshua!
- Up to this point, Israel was a people without a country
- Central theme of Torah: The creation of Israel



STRANGERS IN A FOREIGN LAND

- Just as Abraham left his home land and his past behind, so do Believers leave everything of the past behind
- The Abrahamic Covenant has not yet been FULLY realized
- The ReNewed Covenant has not yet be FULLY realized
- Israel did **NOT** belong anywhere except in Canaan
- Believers do **NOT** belong to this present world
- Egyptians knew Israel didn't belong there
- The world knows that Believers don't belong among them

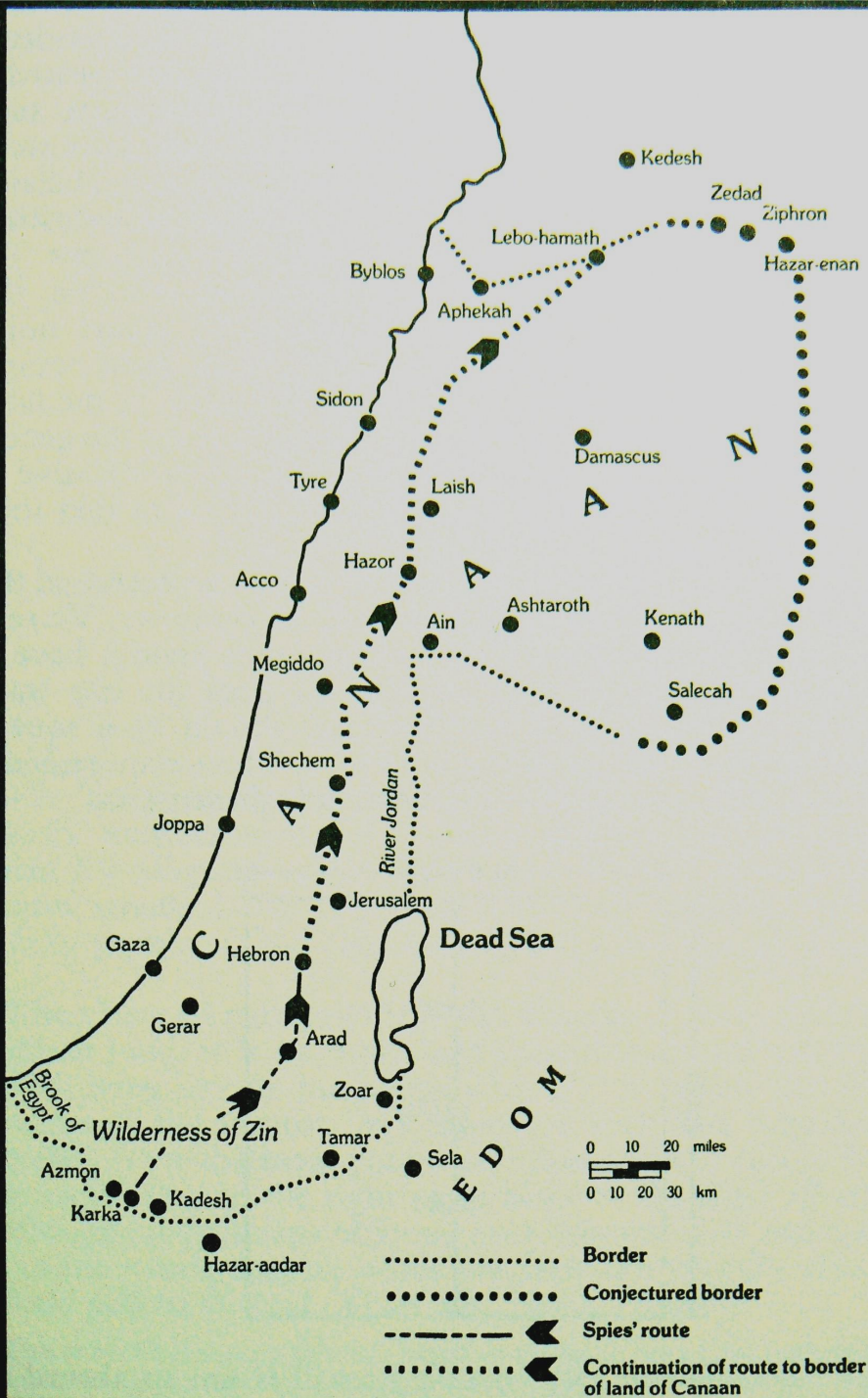
THERE IS A PLACE.....

- Believers don't belong here
- We are precisely where Moses and Israel were in Numbers 33
- We are awaiting the promised place of the covenant
- **OUR TIME SHOULD NOT BE SPENT ON IDLE WAITING!**
- We have much to learn, to practice, and to do
- We can see our destination, but we're not there, yet



NUMBERS 34: BOUNDARIES

- Egyptian records of Canaan's borders are identical to the description of Numbers 34
- Yehoveh did NOT redefine the borders of Canaan/the Promised Land
- The southern boundary is the most disputed
- Nahlah Mishrayim
- This is NOT the Nile River

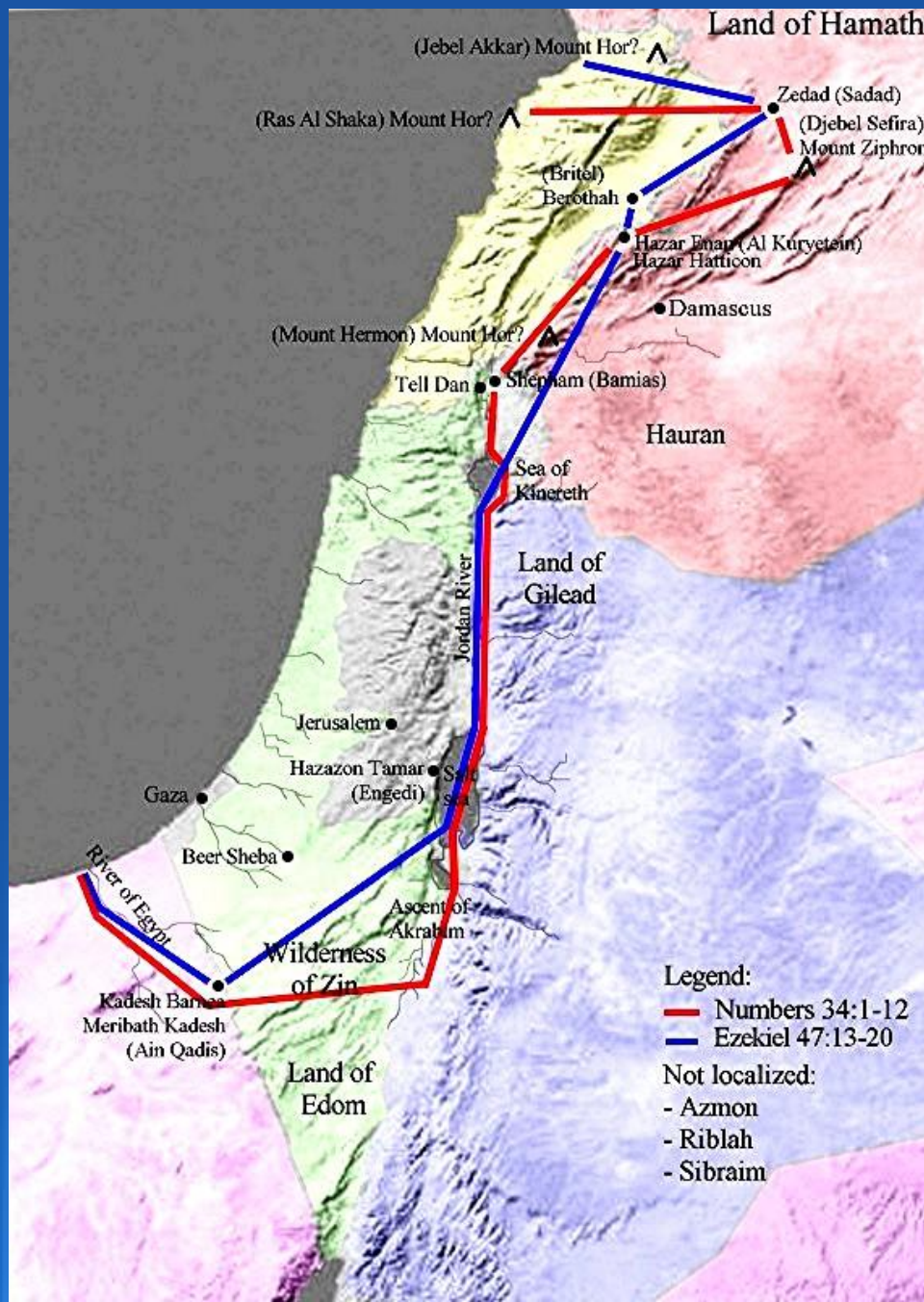


WADI OF EGYPT



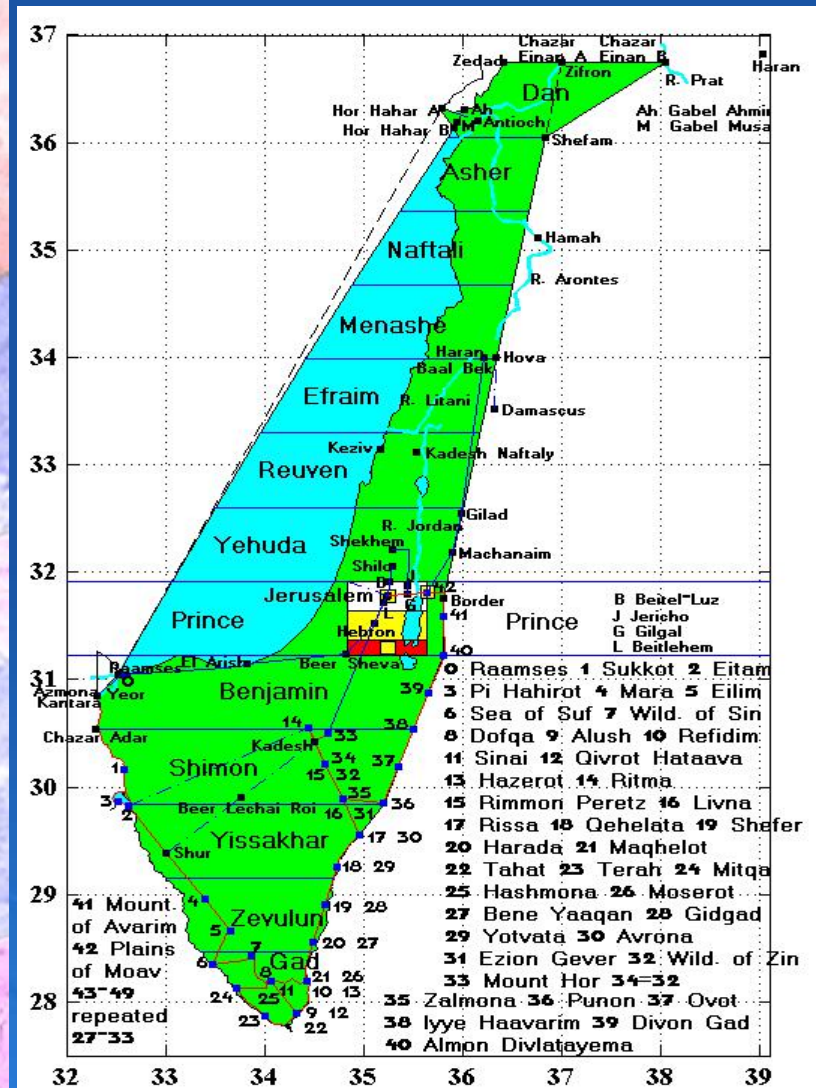
- **Nahlah Mishrayim** = Wadi of Egypt
- Nahlah Mishrayim NEVER used to denote the Nile River
- **Nahlah** means watercourse
- Since these boundaries are of Canaan, it would mean that Canaan reached all the way to the Nile, **INSIDE** of Egypt
- Common knowledge that the Sinai belonged to Egypt, not Canaan
- If Sinai (or east side of the Nile) was Canaan, then the Promised Land was perhaps a 2-day journey!

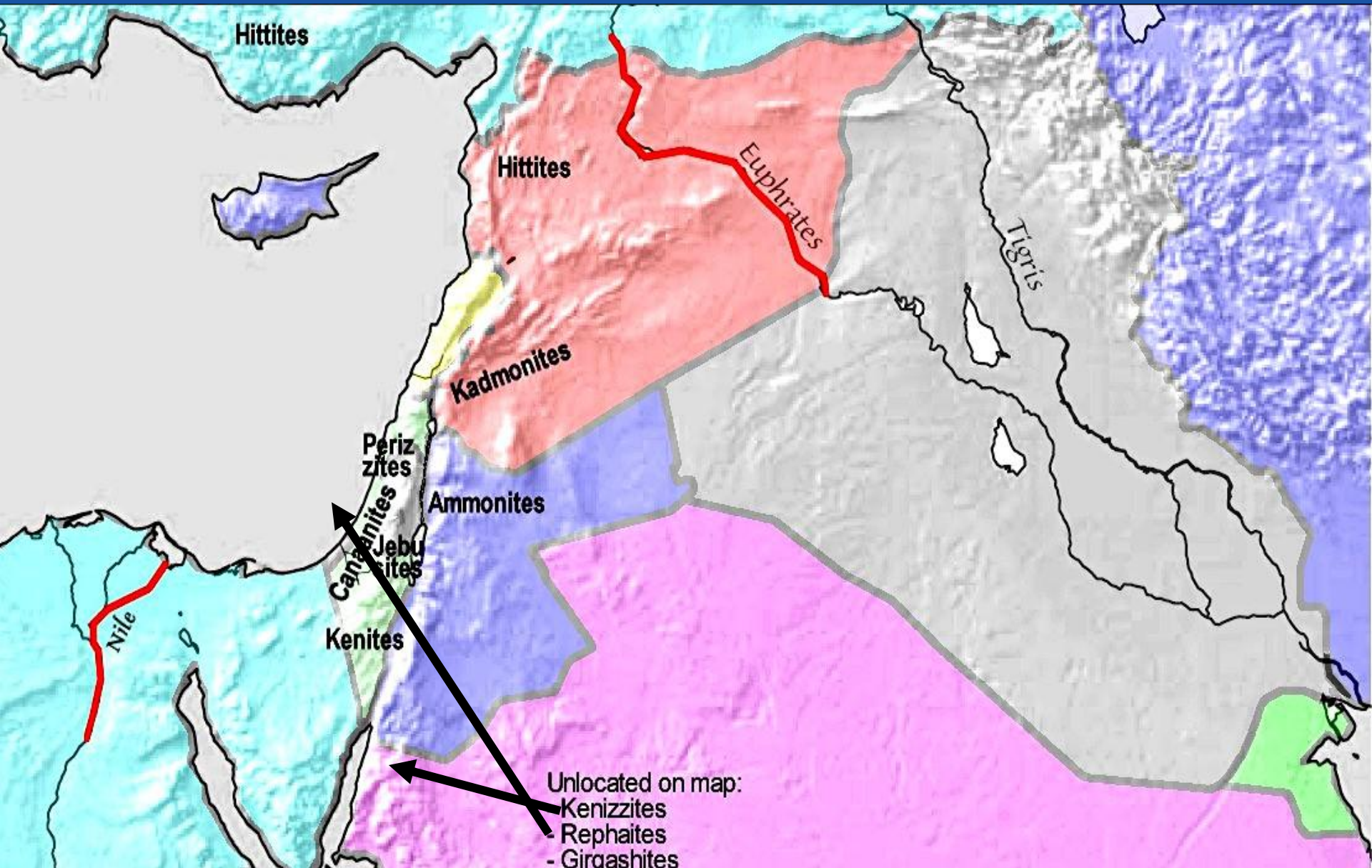


2 DIFFERENT LAND DIVISIONS

THE EZEKIEL DIVISION

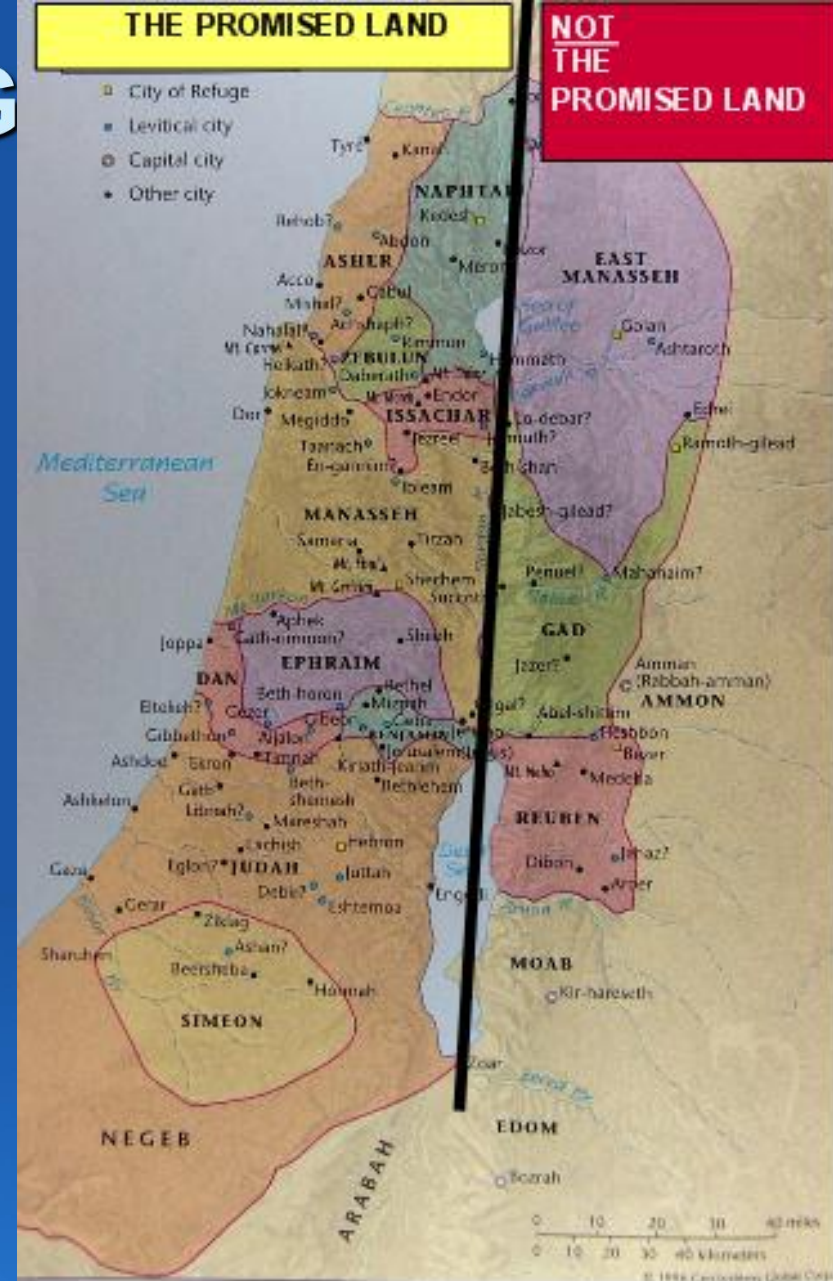


ISRAEL ACCORDING TO ABRAHAM

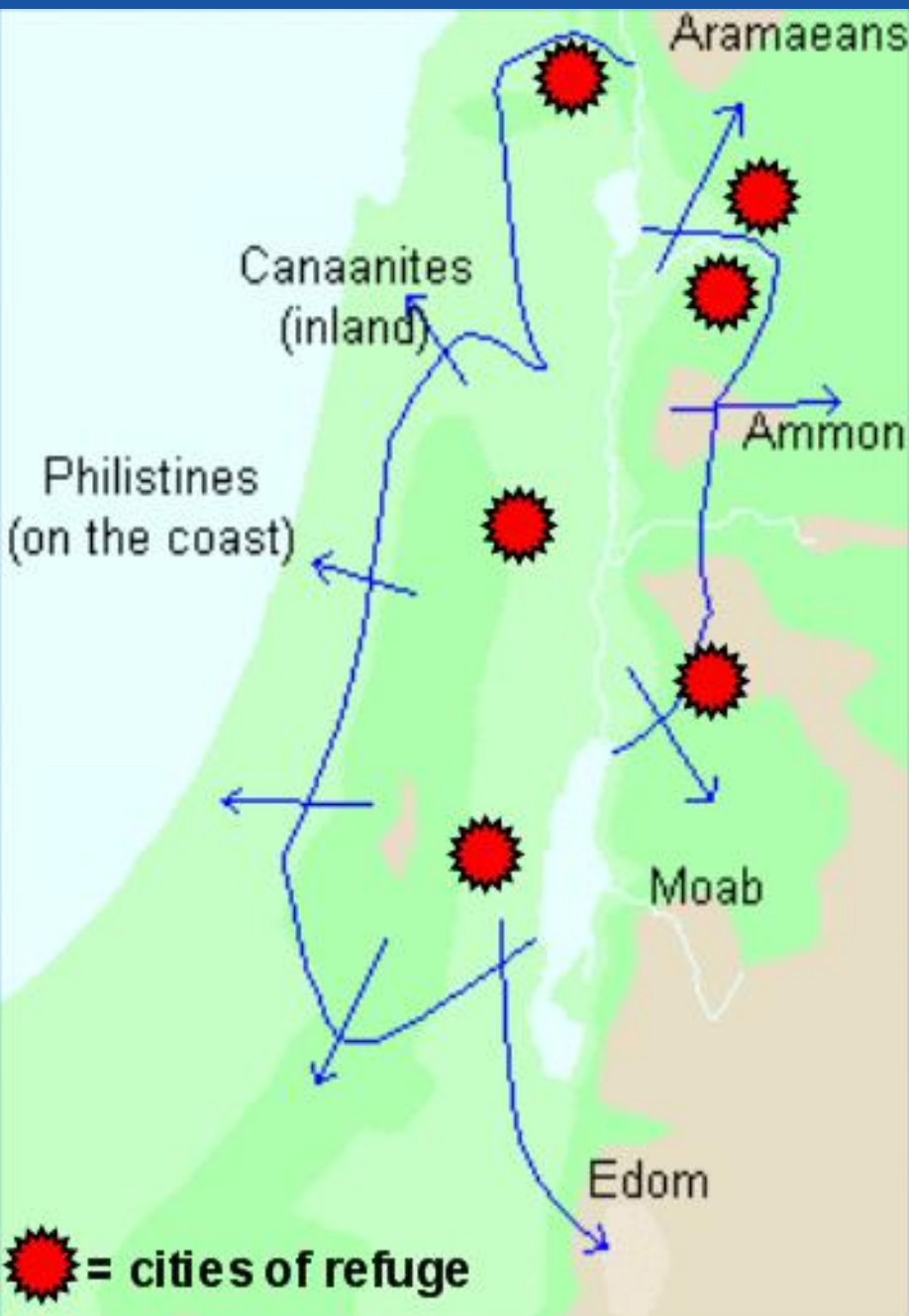


LAND DIVIDED AMONG 9 1/2 TRIBES

- 2 ½ tribes settled in an area that was NOT the Promised Land
- Chieftains of each of the tribes are named
- It was the Chieftains duty to divide the land among the clans of their tribes



NUMBERS 35: THE LEVITES' INHERITANCE



- 48 cities to be set aside for Israel
- Taken from among the 100's of Canaanite villages
- The Levites NEVER received their full compliment of cities
- 6 Cities of Refuge
- 3 on the East side of the Jordan
- 3 on the West side of the Jordan
