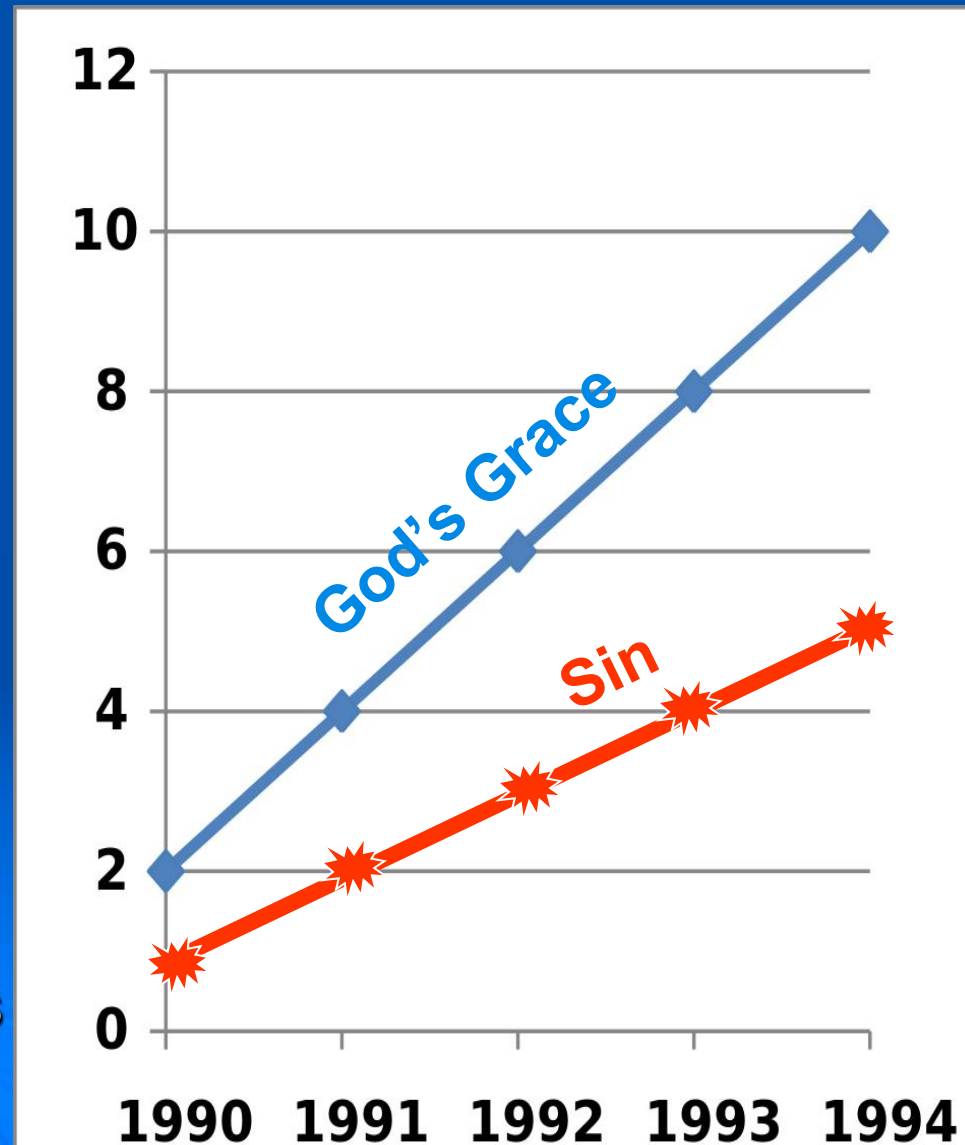


AHEAD OF THE CURVE

- Romans 5:20
- Law given so sins increase; but God's grace increases more
- Straw man says: if more sin equals more grace, then Believers should sin more !
- Romans 6:1, 2 address this absurd assumption
- Paul is surmising about these Roman Believers whom he has never met
- Bible not divided into chapters until the 13th century



THE TRUE MEANING OF GRACE

- Hebrew *chen* = grace *chesed* = loving-kindness
- Greek *charis* = grace, favor, kindness, well being
- Biblically, “grace” = unmerited favor
- Grace needs to be connected to a particular action of God in order for it to have applicable meaning
- In Romans 6, grace is connected to God righteousing people (justifying people) who don't deserve it



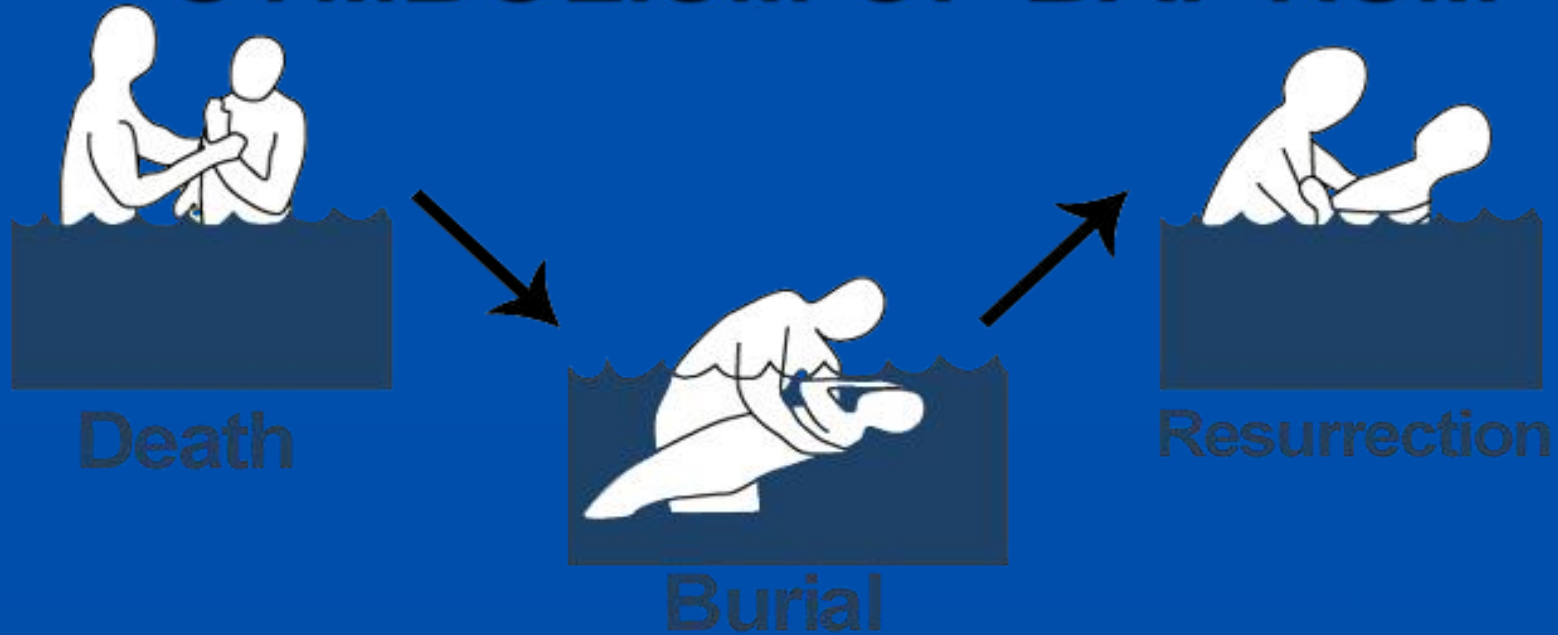
- Romans chapter 6:1 – 2 “....*keep on sinning so that there can be more grace?*” HEAVEN FORBID!
- “**Dying to sin**” Best to understand it in the commonly held Jewish view of Paul’s day
- ***Yetzer ha tov*** = good inclination
- ***Yetzer ha rah*** = evil inclination
- We are mastered either by one or the other
- Pharisees: Doctrine of the Two Ways
- Essenes: Doctrine of the Two Spirits
- Yeshua accepted this same philosophy: Matt. 6:24

BAPTISM



- Concept of baptism as a symbol of dying to sin is connected to the death of Christ
- **Baptizo** = baptize = immerse
- Also means to take on the characteristics of the liquid the cloth is immersed into
- When a Believer is immersed in Christ, he/she absorbs His qualities
- Baptism had become a ritual for gaining membership into the community of Believers

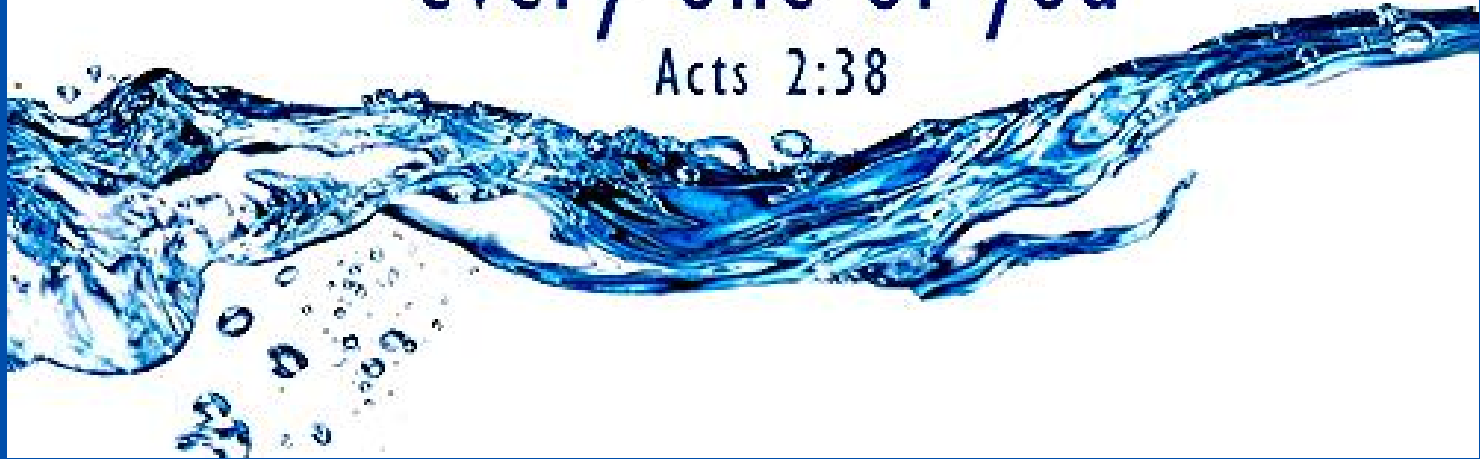
SYMBOLISM OF BAPTISM



- Death is one thing; burial is another
- Burial signals the end of life, the official end of the “old life”
- We identify in baptism with His death and burial so that we can take the next step: Resurrection!
- The Resurrection in Christ that Believers experience is twofold:
- 1) The here and now.....a new quality of life
- 2) The future.....bodily resurrection into a glorified new body

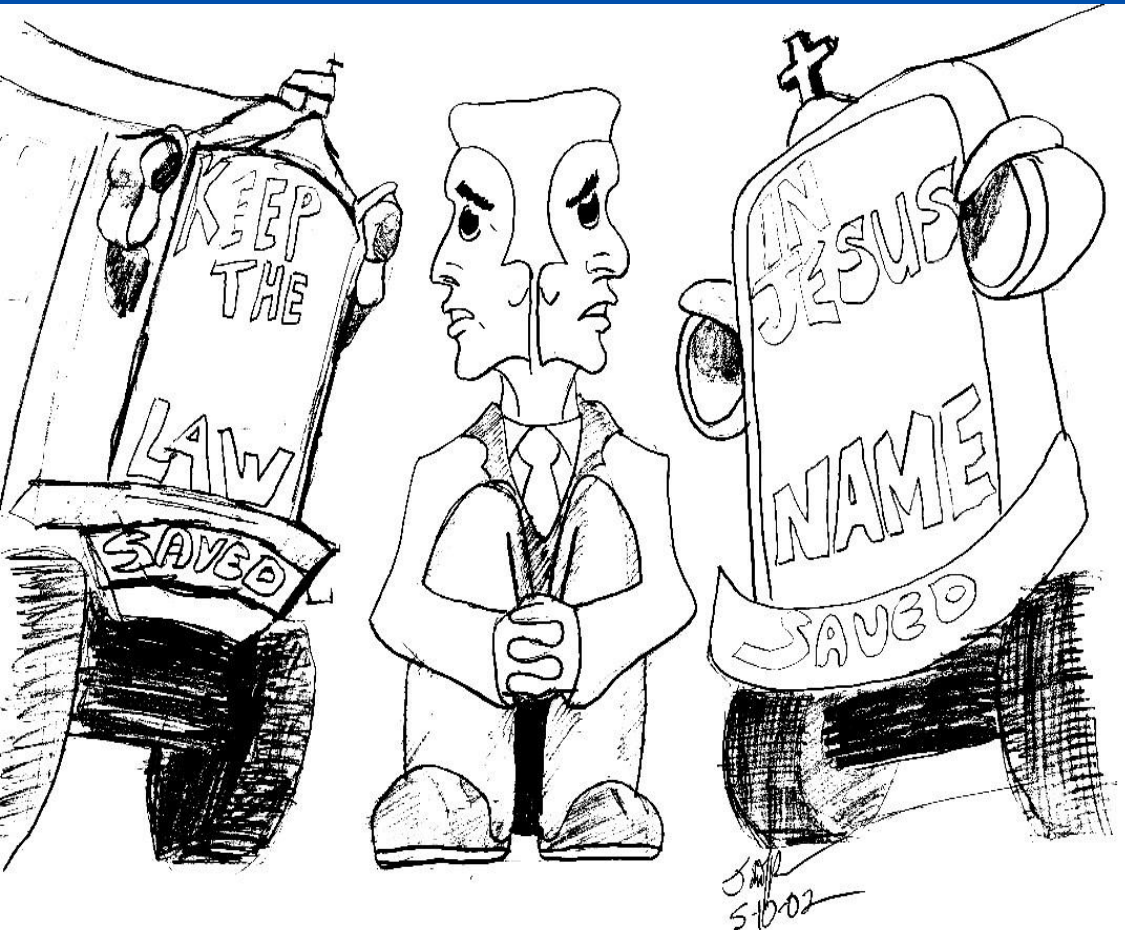
- What about professed Believers who aren't baptized?
- For Paul, baptism is the indispensable ritual moment for Jews and gentiles when we leave our old sin life
- Faith in Christ is assumed BEFORE baptism, so salvation occurs at the moment we believe
- But salvation and all of its effects are NOT immediate
- Baptism is part of the salvation sequence and carries real and tangible consequences with it

DEAD PEOPLE CAN'T SIN

- The “old self” means ALL of us....our whole self
- But our “old self” still exists and lingers on to challenge us daily
- Death and resurrection in Christ is a process
- Yeshua no longer burdened by a fragile body and links to this world....be WE are
- Our new life and identification with Christ can increase daily, but WE are responsible for making that happen



UNDER LAW OR UNDER GRACE ?



- CJB “*under legalism*”
- NAS “*under law*”
- KJV “*under The Law*”
- Definite article “the” is not present in the Greek so is not under “The Law” but rather “under law”
- Paul is NOT placing the Law of Moses in opposition to grace

REDEEMED FROM THE CURSE

- This verse is not saying that grace replaced The Law
- If Paul meant that the Law was abolished, he has set himself against Yeshua Matt.5:17 – 19
- C.E.B. Cranfield Commentary of the Book of Romans
- The curse of the Law comes from disobedience
- Disobedience is sinning
- God's wrath applicable to Jews and to gentiles
- But righteousness, as a free gift from God, exempts us from God's wrath
