

NEAR, MID, AND FAR VIEW




- "Therefore" = what follows is a conclusion
- \triangleright Romans 8:1 = summation of Romans 1 7
- Commentators often see Romans 7 & 8 as a Bible within a Bible, the primary source of Christian doctrine
- It is dangerous to take 2 chapters out of the entire Bible as essentially the molten core of our faith, and even as a "book of corrections"
- A wider context is needed for a well-rounded and proper doctrine



- Bible often made to conform to Paul, especially Romans 7 & 8
- For Church government, the search for truth is over once the Church's doctrines have been established
- The job of the Academic branch is to support the doctrines decided upon by the Church government


CONTEXT IS THE KEY



- Always dangerous to work backward from a doctrine in order to establish it in the Bible
- To take 2 chapters out of the entire Bible (Rom. 7, 8) as having the most weight for doctrine is a bad idea
- Weight of words: The Father, Christ, Moses, then all other Biblical writers and characters


PAUL IS THE JEWISH APOSTLE TO THE GENTILES

- Paul is most venerated by the Church because he is the Apostle to the Gentiles
- Paul seen as a sort of "specialist" in gentile theology
- Paul's words typically stripped of their Jewish cultural context
- For Early Church Fathers, Jews and Judaism were a mystery



ROMANS CHAPTER 8: NO CONDEMNATION





- Paul's conclusion from chapters 1 7 is NOT that the Law is dead!
- Vs. 1 "No longer any condemnation...in union with Messiah..."
- Today "condemn" means to denounce someone
- In the Bible "condemn" means the death sentence
- Law came in 3 forms:
- 1) direct law2) Natural law3) The Law of Moses

NO ETERNAL DEATH PENATLY



- Believers still die (go to the grave)
- The ONLY aspect of The Law that "changes" is that we don't suffer the curse of The Law for sinning
- Curse = eternal death penalty
- "Law" of the Spirit, versus "Law" of sin and death
- Law in this case more means "principle"
- Law of the two Spirits is the same as the doctrine of the Two Masters
- Essene theology

THE LAW IS THE ROADMAP

The Law cannot change human nature because it was not designed to


The Law defines sin, tells us God's nature, what righteous living is, and how to make peace with God

- The Law was God being accommodating to His people
- The sacrificial system is grace







THE HUMANNESS OF YESHUA



- Paul says that Yeshua came in the "likeness" of sinful flesh
- This means that although Christ came with sinful flesh, He never succumbed to it
- Yeshua could suffer, feel pain, be hungry and thirsty, have the emotions of fear and anxiety
- ➤ Matt. 26:38 39
- ▶ Luke 22:42 33
- > John 1:1

- As the Word in flesh, Yeshua of course obeyed His own Word (Torah) perfectly!
- ➤ Deut. 30:11 14
- Since Yeshua had an evil inclination, He had free will
- > Matt. 26:39
- Arisen, Christ no longer had an evil inclination
- Upon our resurrection we will no longer be encumbered with an evil inclination





- Why did Paul spend so much time speaking on the same 2 or 3 principles?
- They were taken for granted within Judaism in his day
- This letter directly written for the Roman congregations
- In his "Guide for the Perplexed" RamBam says that The Law has NO effect upon human nature, and nothing can, and God wouldn't interfere
- Paul was refuting this doctrine because Yeshua's advent can change human nature
